MIRROR LAKE STATE PARK REPORT

all is once again getting ready to settle in at Mirror Lake State Park. This has been an exciting season for the park with the celebration of fifty years of enjoyment by the public. Reflecting back on

half a century, the park has seen a lot of change, but one constant has been the natural beauty that tens of thousands of visitors enjoy each year.

Much as the Seth Peterson Cottage was designed to be part of its surroundings and engage the occupant in this special place, so, too, the park encourages the visitor to find joy in the

beauty of Mirror Lake. And, like the Cottage, the park requires upkeep and care to keep it in a condition that visitors can safely and pleasantly enjoy.

Over the last five decades we have built a new office, added campsites and shower buildings, expanded the trails to about twenty miles, improved roads and facilities, and completed a wide variety of other projects and programs, all to the benefit of park visitors.

This has, so far, been one of the best and busiest seasons for the park. Through the month of July we saw 200,000 daily visitors and more than 35,000 camper nights. These are great numbers, as we were at 180,000 visitors and about the same number of camper nights by this time last year. All those visitors have required a great deal of work on the part of our staff and volunteers. We had fewer staff than in some previous years, but we were lucky to have almost all returning summer staff, and everyone worked very hard to keep the park to the standards our visitors expect.

Another change for this year was higher entrance and camping fees. While some visitors were not excited to pay a little more for their stay, most saw the higher fees as an investment in a great park experience. Fees had not been raised for a number of years, and this year saw a moderate increase in vehicle admissions, camping fees, and electrical site fees. With more visitors and slightly

higher fees, the park's revenue has increased by 31 percent so far this year. This is particularly good news, since this also marks the first year that the State Parks Program is fully self-funded. We hope to continue to provide the high-quality experience that visitors expect moving forward into the new funding structure.

We are excited to be the home of the Seth Peterson Cottage, and continue to direct visitors to explore the Cottage on open house days. Additionally, the support from the Cottage Conservancy goes a long way to help with our educational programs and presentations and is much appreciated.

As our fiftieth season draws to a close, we are proud to have provided many years of memories to all our visitors. We look forward to fifty more years and beyond.

For the immediate future, the fall and winter provide for some of the best experiences at the park. Fall color viewing, hiking, and boating are all more popular than ever, and we hope for plenty of snow for skiing and snowshoeing this winter.

We hope to see you at the park.

We continue to do our lake clean-up and harvesting of aquatic vegetation to control and eradicate invasive species and stress best land management practices.

MY VIEW OF THE COTTAGE

orn to an adventurous mother and a geologist father, my childhood was spent exploring the backroads of the Southwest. This constant desert travel rooted my artistic soul in classic



landscape photography. Always with a camera in my hand, I couldn't help but take photos of the beautiful landscapes around me.

At fifteen, I discovered a Frank Lloyd Wright book that my brother, who is an architect, had in our home. I was fascinated by all the colors and shapes but, more importantly, I fell in love with how Mr. Wright blended, so effortlessly, the Sonoran desert landscapes I loved with his architecture and home at Taliesin West. In that moment I was hooked on Frank Lloyd Wright.

About five years ago, I had the opportunity to teach a photography workshop to kids at Taliesin West and my passion for photography and architecture grew even more. It has really been an honor to have the opportunity to not only photograph Wright sites but also to teach photography to a new generation of photographers and see that same big grin on their faces that I had when I discovered photography. I teach so that my students will someday be better photographers than I am.

Now, I am on a journey to photograph all of Mr. Wright's buildings...more than five hundred of them. The journey has been a long but rewarding one and the people I have met along the way have been incredible. I was so excited when I heard I would have the opportunity to photograph the Seth Peterson Cottage. Out of all the Wright sites I've seen, it's always the smaller ones I enjoy the most. Even better, the Cottage is surrounded by beautiful trees and overlooks a beautiful lake.

I have learned that light and landscape views were very important to Mr. Wright—so much so that he would sometimes direct you, through his architectural design, to pause and enjoy them. The Seth Peterson Cottage windows are like a big screen TV that is always playing an awesome nature show. I really wanted this relationship to show through my photography of the space.

Usually, photographers want even light, but this is not necessarily so in this case. I loved the streaking light and shadows that danced around the space while I was there, and how at the end of the day the most beautiful golden light shines directly in on the space. It is truly a magical space of light and I am honored to have had a few moments to photograph it.

KRISTIN VISSER AWARD APPLICATION

pplicants are sought for the 2017 Kristin Visser Historical Preservation Award which is given every other year to an individual or organization in recognition of past work in historical preservation of a Frank Lloyd Wright or Prairie School building in Wisconsin or a contiguous state. THE SETH PETERSON COTTAGE A Living Legacy

This is the twentieth and final excerpt from the book, Frank Lloyd Wright's Seth Peterson Cottage: Rescuing a Lost Masterwork, by John Eifler, AIA, and Kristin Visser. It is the definitive story of the Cottage.



he Seth Peterson Cottage Conservancy began as a group of concerned citizens who saw the potential of a forgotten work by a master architect. They viewed the Cottage not as an eyesore but rather as an integral component of their local history and a part of their community. From enthusiastic but naive beginnings, the SPCC learned how to raise a significant amount of capital and manage a cultural icon using an innovative and profitable approach. If there is a single ingredient to which the Seth Peterson Cottage rehabilitation owed its successful completion, it was the optimistic and determined attitude of Audrey Laatsch and the other members of the Board of Directors of the Seth Peterson Cottage Conservancy, who had the courage and determination to make the rehabilitation a reality. The board developed a carefully considered plan for the rehabilitation and subsequent use of the Cottage, a plan that protected the historic integrity of the building while incorporating changes needed to ensure successful operation of the Cottage as a vacation rental. Once they had developed a plan, they stuck to their vision through long negotiations with state agencies.

The Seth Peterson Cottage project offers lessons in public-private cooperation, not only to the State of Wisconsin, but to other organizations and individuals interested in preservation. The Cottage, for years a white elephant, was transformed into an economically self-sufficient venture. The conservancy agreed to rehabilitate the structure primarily with privately raised money, easing the fears of state officials regarding public expense. In return, the conservancy received state authorization and seed money.

Many states own significant historic structures that need rehabilitation and new utilization strategies. Perhaps these states should reevaluate the current status of those buildings and look toward the private sector to implement programs to preserve publicly owned historic sites. On the other hand, a willing private sector must round out the equation. As of this writing, the states of Wisconsin, Maryland, Virginia, and New York are addressing similar preservation issues, regarding stateowned property and private initiatives. The public-private partnership is slowly evolving as a preferred alternative to the limited options available through the public sector alone. Such joint relationships promote the restoration and use of historic buildings, encourage all aspects of historic preservation, and give the public a more direct sense of ownership of our cultural heritage.

OPEN HOUSE DETAILS

he Frank Lloyd Wright-designed Seth Peterson Cottage is open for tours the second Sunday of each month from 1:00-3:30 pm. Reservations are not required.

Admission is \$4.00 for adults; children 12 and under Free. Seth Peterson Cottage Conservancy members receive free admission. The Open House schedule is listed on the last page of this newsletter. The open house tours attract more than a thousand visitors a year!

Group tours for 10 or more people or special private tours can be arranged by calling 608-393-7472. These tours can only occur on days when there are no reservations or on the days after guests have checked out and before the new guests have arrived—generally between 10:00 am-4:00 pm. There is an extra charge for group and special tours.


